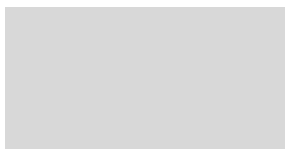

Plan under which each student is assigned to a faculty member or trained adviser, who through regular meetings helps the student plan and implement immediate and long-term academic and vocational goals

Completion of a college program of study in fewer than the usual number of years, most often by attending summer sessions and carrying extra courses during the regular academic term

Applicant who is offered admission to a degree-granting program at your institution

Admission assistance, support, orientation and other services especially for adults who have started college for the first time, or who are entering after a lapse of a few years

Applicant having origin in any of the following geographic areas: Alaska, Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Vermont, Virginia, Washington, West Virginia, Wisconsin, Wyoming

: A doctor's degree that is conferred upon completion of a program providing the knowledge and skills for the recognition, credential, or license required for professional practice. The degree is awarded after a period of study such that the total time to the degree, including both pre-professional and professional preparation, equals at least six full-time equivalent academic years. Some of these degrees were formerly classified as "first professional" and may include Chiropractic (D.C. or D.C.M.); Dentistry (DDS or DMD); Law (LL.B. or J.D.); Medicine (M.D.); Optometry (O.D.); Osteopathic Medicine (D.O.); Pharmacy

**A document certifying the successful completion of a prescribed
secondary school program of studies, or the attainment of satisfactory scores on the Tests of General Educational
Development (GED), or another state specified examination**

Assumed double occupancy in institutional housing and 19 meals per week (or as in meal plan).

Information maintained by the secondary school that may include such things as the student's high school transcript, class rank, GPA, and teacher and counselor recommendations

A calendar system that consists of two semesters during the academic year with about 16 weeks for each semester of instruction. There may be an additional summer session

A program of study based on individual interests, designed with the assistance of an adviser

Any arrangement by which a student completes part of the college program studying in another country. Can be at a campus abroad or through a cooperative agreement with some other U.S. college or an institution of another country.

A summer session is shorter than a regular semester and not considered part of the academic year. It is not the third term of an institution operating on a trimester system or the fourth term of an institution operating on a quarter calendar system. The institution may have 2 or more sessions occurring in the summer months. Some schools, such as vocational and beauty schools, have year-round classes with separate summer sessions

Special consideration given to students with demonstrated talent/abilities in areas of interest to the institution (eg, sports, theater, languages, etc).

Programs designed to prepare students to meet the requirements for certification as teachers in elementary, middle/junior high, and secondary schools

An individual who has fulfilled the institution's requirements to be considered for admission (including payment or waiving of the application fee, if any) and who has previously attended another college or university and earned college-level credit

A student entering the institution for the first time but known to have previously attended a postsecondary institution at the same level (eg, undergraduate). The student may transfer with or without credit

Assume two round trips to student's hometown per year for students in institutional housing or daily travel to and from your institution for commuter students

An academic year consisting of 3 terms of about 15 weeks each

Amount of money charged to students for instructional services. Tuition may be charged per term, per course, or per credit

May range from one-on-one tutoring in specific subjects to tutoring in an area such as math, reading, or writing. Most tutors are college students; at some colleges, they are specially trained and certified

A standard of measurement representing hours of academic instruction (eg, semester credit, quarter credit, clock hour).

A student enrolled in a four- or five-year bachelor's degree program, an associate degree program, or a vocational or technical program below the baccalaureate

Opportunities offered to undergraduate students to make original contributions in an academic discipline via the exploration of a specific research topic. Research opportunities may or may not be associated with a specific course or earned credit

Helps veterans and their dependents obtain benefits for their selected program and provides certifications to the Veterans Administration. May also provide personal counseling on the transition from the military to civilian life

Any person whose sight loss is not correctable and is sufficiently severe as to adversely affect
