

My student had an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) in high school. Will those services automatically transfer to USF?

No. In order to receive accommodations and services at USF, a student must register with Students Accessibility Services (SAS) by submitting a completed Application for Accommodations and Services. Students should also submit any available documentation (medical, school, other provider) that demonstrates the current need for accommodations. 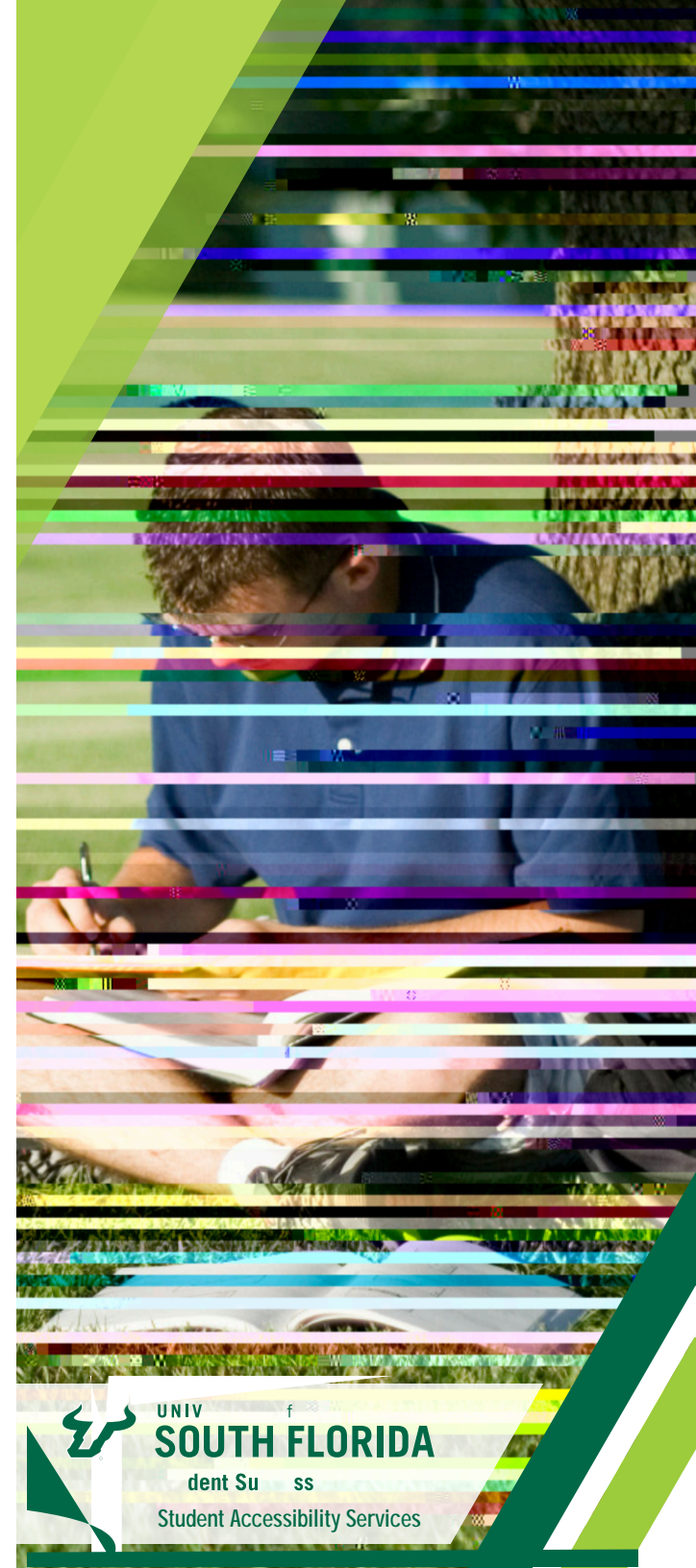
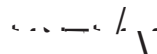

- ✓ Carefully research what forms and documentation are needed to apply for accommodations.
- ✓ Submit accommodations paperwork early so that services are in place when classes begin.
